President of Iowa Association Gives a Talk and Explains in Detail How Wool is Handled

A small but enthusiastic crowd of sheep and wool men met in the Farm Bureau office Monday night to hear W. Latta, of Logan, tell of the work and organization of the Iowa Wool Growers Association. Mr. Latta, as president of the organization, explained in detail how the wool is handled when it comes to the state organization.

Mr. Latta explained in detail how the wool is handled when it comes to the state organization. He made up of many smaller organizations, such as Crawford, Boone and many more counties did not.

The wool is then shipped to the commission house which the state association contracts with to handle the wool. The 1919 clip that the state association has been allowed to handle this year's clip. Each wool sack is weighed as soon as it is received at the commission house. The receiving does not check with the shipping weights marked on the sack. It is reweighed so that the weight is absolutely correct. Next the sack is opened and each fleece thrown out on the grading table. Expert graders determine the grade by the length, fineness and strength of the wool. There are twelve wool grades. The fleeces are then put into piles according to their grades.

GRIDDLE CAKES and WAFFLES

Backsheat Cakes

2 cups buckwheat flour
1 cup flour

1 1/2 teaspoon salt
2 1/2 cups milk or milk and water
1 tablespoon molasses
1 tablespoon shortening

Sift together flours, baking powder and salt; add liquid, molasses and melted shortening; beat three minutes. Bake on hot greased griddle.

Waffles

2 cups flour
4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups milk
2 eggs
1 tablespoon melted shortening

Sift flour, baking powder and salt together; add milk to yolks of eggs; mix thoroughly and add to dry ingredients; add melted shortening and mix in beaten whites of eggs. Bake in well greased hot waffle iron until brown. Serve hot with maple syrup. It should take about 1 1/2 minutes to bake each waffle.
