THE REPUBLICAN NOMINEES

Mention has been made in these columns during the last two weeks of some of the republican nominees for county office. This week we refer to the remainder of the ticket.

Robert Ewall
For the office of county recorder the republicans have chosen a young man in the person of Robert Ewall, whose work during the past number of years has been such as to fit him for the office. Mr. Ewall is a Crawford county product, having been born and reared in the county. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Nels Ewall, now deceased, and received his education in the Denison city schools. After completing his education he entered into a partnership with Ben Bartscher, and under the firm name of Bartscher & Ewall conducted a lucrative furniture business in Denison for a number of years. Mr. Bartscher desiring to go west, the firm retired from the business and later Mr. Ewall acted as cashier for the Chicago & Northwestern railway for some time. Shortly after the Nicholson Ice & Produce company was organized, Mr. Ewall engaged employment with the company and has remained as bookkeeper until just recently when he went to the Boys' store as bookkeeper with Ben Bartscher, and under the firm name of Bartscher & Ewall conducted the office of that large concern. In every position Mr. Ewall has held he has been a trustworthy and efficient servant, and should be elected to the office to which he is appointed. He will serve the people of Crawford county in the same efficient manner. He is a man of family, having married into one of the best families in Crawford county, when he took as his wife Miss Minnie Craft, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. K. Craft, for years residents of Willow township, and who now live in Denison. He is a property owner and taxpayer, and has the interest of the county and the taxpayers at heart. T. W. Walker
The office of county attorney is an important one, and an office that demands competent administration; the affairs of the office require constant attention, in fact the county attorney as the adviser of all county officers, and much depends upon the ability of the attorney. For many years a dozen years past Mr. Walker has been city attorney for Denison and during that time has rendered valuable services to the city. He has made a study of municipal law and became well versed along all lines of city administration, and on more than one occasion his opinion has been sought by attorneys dealing with municipal affairs. He is a graduate of the Denison high school and after grad-

uating entered the state university at Iowa City, where he spent four years as a law student, and graduated from that institution with honors. Ever since the city of Denison took over the buggy for the city, he has been in the employ of the city, as business manager of the light department as well as city attorney, and he conducted the affairs of that office to the satisfaction of most patrons and one who will devote his entire time to the affairs of the office.

E. N. Sandstrom
Two supervisors are to be elected for the 1921 term, and the republican voters at the June primaries displayed the best of judgment when they selected the above named gentlemen. Mr. Sandstrom lives in Stockholm township in one capacity or another for many years and has done so with the best of satisfaction, and he is assured of a very large vote in his township.
