

HERMAN SCHULTZ ANSWERS CALL

After Many Weeks of Patient Suffering, Herman Schultz, One of Best Known Men of Schleswig, Dies

BEDETTEN FOR TWELVE WEEKS

Decreased Came to Crawford County in 1874 and Settled on a Farm in Hanover Township

From the Schleswig Leader of October 7th, we take the following account of the illness, death and burial of Herman Schultz, an old and highly respected citizen of Crawford county.

After many weeks of patient suffering, the spirit of Herman Schultz, mayor of Schleswig, took its departure on Monday, October 4th, at five in the afternoon, at his late home.

Mr. Schultz was born at Tempo, Brandenburg, Oct. 11, 1826, and in 1848 came to this country when still a young man. He settled first in Chicago where, on March 1, 1874, he was united in marriage to Miss Emma Clara Thomas.

He resided until moving to town a few years ago. On Dec. 8, 1906, he died. His wife was the mother of twelve children, all of whom but two, who died in infancy, are left to mourn the loss of their father.
