[SPECIALS TO COURIER.] On the 12th, we issued the following Extra from dispatches received by us:

TONGUE RIVER CANTONMENT, June 3d, 1877. Indian runners just in say Red Cloud Agency has rebelled.

McKenzie was killed at a council preceding the difficulty; that Crazy Horse has broken his pledge and is on the war-path with his entire band.
