

OUR PRESIDENTS.

Who are Dead, and When They Died.

There have been fifteen persons elected by the people to the office of President of the United States. Of this number the present incumbent is the only survivor. It is true that Messrs. Fillmore and Andrew Johnson, who were chosen Vice-Presidents, and became Presidents by the death of their chiefs, Taylor and Lincoln, are still living.

The second and third, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, deceased while the sixth President was in office. The fourth President, James Madison, and the fifth, James Monroe, expired during the administration of Andrew Jackson.

Abraham Lincoln, the fourteenth President, as is well known, was assassinated in April, 1865, being the second month of his second term. We give below a table showing the number of years each President lived after the expiration of his presidential term, taking no account of odd months:
