Prospect of New Mills.—Gentlemen from Butte advise us that Mr. McClure, representing the St. Louis owners of the ten stamp Swallow mill at Highland, is in Butte looking over the ground with a view to removing the mill to that place. He is authorized if one hundred tons of \$100, ore donated to close the negotiations and bring over the mill which it is thought can be done in ninety days. The mill was erected to reduce good ore, and will have to be supplied with new amalgamating pans to work the silver ores of Butte. It is believed the negotiations will be closed favorably.
