How Disposed of and to What Purposes Applied. As Act for the benefit of Common Schools. Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Montana.

Section 1. That all moneys arising from the sale of town lots, under and by virtue of the several acts of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Montana, relating to town-sites, that now is or may hereafter, come into the hands of any Probate Judge, or the corporate authorities of any city or town of this Territory shall be paid into the county treasury of the county for the use and benefit of the common schools of the school district in which such city or town is situated, to be used as provided for in this act.
