A SHOCKING DEATH.

John H. Helm, of Helmsville, Received a Death Blow from a Horse.

Dr. J. H. Owings received a dispatch from Avon Monday night to the effect that a man was seriously injured at Helmsville, and to come at once with instruments. The dispatch was signed J. H. Helm. The doctor took the night train for Garrison and on arriving at that place telegraphed to Avon for more particulars. He then learned that J. H. Helm was the injured man, having received a kick from a horse that broke his skull, and that a team was in waiting at Avon to convey the doctor to Helmsville.

After a tedious ride of 30 miles over a bad road, the doctor arrived at the home of the injured man about 4 o'clock in the morning. It seems that Mr. Helm, on Sunday afternoon, in attempting to drive a mare and young colt into a stable, received a terrible kick from the mare in his forehead, crushing his skull and crushing the brain in a horrible manner. A casual examination of the unfortunate man by Dr. Owings showed that there was no possible hope of recovery, and about 9 o'clock a. m. Mr. Helm breathed his last. Besides his wife and children, Mrs. Father DeByckere and Dr. Owings were present at his death. He was buried at Helmsville yesterday.

Mr. Helm was born in Bremen in 1832, and was therefore about 64 years of age. He came to Deer Lodge county in 1869, where, in company with A. Harpison, he engaged in mining for about ten years. He afterwards engaged in ranching, which pursuit he followed until his death. He was well known throughout this section, and served two terms as county commissioner of Deer Lodge county.
