

LOCAL NEWS.

Fitzpatrick & Co. are turning out brick for T. C. Power & Bro's new store.

Ed. Keister, Anderson, Nottingham, and James Grey are in town from Highwood.

The Record job office turned out some fine card work for Wm. Foster, the Tonsorial Artist, this week.

The Col. McLeod is expected this evening and will remain here to receive the 7th Infantry.

Mr. J. C. Bourassa's brick residence on Front street will be an ornament to that portion of the town.

Mr. W. S. Conway purchased of Herman Brinkman, yesterday, the house and lot situated opposite the Court House and known as the Brinkman corner.

T. F. Healy, accompanied by his sister, returned to their Sun River home on this morning's coach.

The blonde boy, which took place on Wednesday night, was largely attended, and in spite of the combative tendencies of some of the guests present there was but little damage done. One chair was badly demoralized, and to use the words of the occupant, "it isn't got up yet."

Mr. Ed. Smith has come to say that he is much obliged to the parties who nominated him for Justice of the Peace, but declines to become a candidate for the office.

Mr. Frank, the popular Tonsorial artist of Helena, has been spending a week or so at the head of navigation. Frank desires to return thanks to the people of Benton, particularly those who aided him in procuring his stolen property, and feels so well pleased with the river metropolis that he thinks seriously of coming again to remain permanently.

Mr. Charles Rowe has made a remarkable success of fruit culture on his fine farm near the Missouri, having raised watermelons, muskmelons, and other varieties of fruit and some of the finest vegetables we have ever seen. There is no question that the lands adjoining the big muddy are as well adapted to agriculture as any in the Territory, not excepting the famous Bitter Root country.

The Steamer Helena was presented with a handsome pair of horns previous to her departure from Benton on her last trip to Bismarck. The Helena is well entitled to the horns, having made the quickest round trip, the latest arrival, and the greatest number of trips in one season, on record.

We were informed last week that a party of Sioux from Sitting Bull's band had gone to Tongue River to make overtures of peace. Since then we have heard nothing of the party and the report lacks confirmation.

A messenger arrived last night from Cow Island, two days out, and reports the Steamer Josephine and Red Cloud at that point. The Steamer Col. McLeod left the island on Monday at 2 o'clock p.m.

Mr. J. W. Patrick returned from the Bear Paw mines, yesterday. He brought with him some gold retort, which he has on exhibition at Dr. Turner's drug store. The gold was taken from one of Mr. Patrick's quartz lodes, which is located in the new mining district and within 30 miles of the Missouri river.

Mr. Geo. D. Patterson, who has secured a ranch on the Shonkin, is expected to arrive in a few days with four thousand sheep recently purchased from Governor Potts.

Lumber continues to arrive in large quantities and building is progressing rapidly throughout the town. As mechanics will have material to work with the coming winter, those who contemplate building can make satisfactory arrangements with builders.

James McGowan has taken up a ranch adjoining the military reservation and has built a comfortable house upon the same.

Tom Hill, one of the Nez Perce prisoners sent down the river on the Col. McLeod, was taken prisoner by Gen. Miles at the Bear Paw, last fall. The Gen. sent him with Capt. John and others to scout and bring in any stragglers they might find. They proceeded to the Sioux camp, where their horses were taken from them by Sitting Bull. Tom says he was afraid to come in among the whites again.

Messrs. I. G. Baker & Co. sent this week five hundred head of beef cattle to Fort Peck and Poplar Creek Agency.

The Steamer Col. McLeod left for Cow Island on Saturday, the 14th. The eleven Nez Perce Indians taken prisoners on the Marias were on board in charge of a detachment of the 7th Infantry, who are taking them to join Chief Joseph and his band.

Company F, 7th Infantry, Captain Constant Williams commanding, marched for Cow Island on Tuesday, where they will embark for Bismarck.

Among the passengers of the Steamer Col. McLeod, down trip, was Mrs. Capt. Williams and daughter.

Hon. W. A. Thompson, Gov. H. Brooks and Jos. A. Baker left on Monday's coach to attend the Territorial Convention at Virginia City. Choteau will be well represented at Montana's former Capital, and hopes to have the honor of nominating the standard bearer of the Democracy at the Convention.
