INDIANA—HER GROWING TRADE. [CONTINUED.] The House of Ezra Smith & Co., Richmond.

Within the last few years the school furniture business has grown to be a very important feature of our manufacturing interest. Not only does the natural increase of our youthful population add largely to the demand for this class of goods, but the awakening interest in education, combined with the desire that our schools should be supplied with everything that will aid in this work, has induced men of enterprise in different parts of the country to devote themselves to the task of supplying this demand. The vase is two feet in diameter at the top and would make a beautiful ornament for any yard. 
