What the Calves Want. If a calf has a ration of half oats and half corn and half a feed of it or a little more—that is, a little more than half of what it would eat up clean if it had a chance—and if the place of the grass is taken by good clover hay, with shelter from storms and protection from excessive cold, with plenty of salt and pure water, the calf will pay for it all, even if corn were 40 cents a bushel.

Wood Ashes for Cows. In the early settlement of the country, when cows had access to newly cleared land with its burned and charred stumps, they used often to go to where the charcoal was piled up and lick up the charcoal. Many farmers believe that cows thus allowed to lick up the charcoal are less liable to absorb than those kept in close stables.


