Death of an Iowa Veteran.

Marshalltown, Ia., April 14.—Colonel Elliott Shurtz, one of the best known war veterans in this state, is dead at the Soldiers' home, aged 74. As a boy he served through the Mexican war. In the civil war he served in the Thirtieth Iowa infantry, and was commissioned a colonel for conspicuous gallantry on the field of Shiloh.

Three Killed by Boiler Explosion.

Grinnell, Ia., April 10.—Frank Meyers, Dudley Boyd and James Shaffer were instantly killed in a boiler explosion at Plover, a small town south of this place. The men were employed in a sawmill. James Carter, the proprietor, sustained serious injuries. The three victims were literally blown to fragments.

Miss Ellen Stone Arrives.

New York, April 11.—Miss Ellen M. Stone, the missionary who was captured by brigands in Bulgaria and held for ransom, arrived here yesterday on the Deutschland. She looked pale and weary, but said the ordeal had made her very ill. She was met at the steamer's pier by her brother, Charles A. Stone, and by many other relatives and friends. Miss Stone said the brigands were not so fierce as might have been imagined. They said many insulting things, but never struck or beat either her or her companion, Mme. Tsilka.

Diplomatic Relations Ruptured.

Berlin, April 11.—Diplomatic relations between Switzerland and Italy have been ruptured. This action arises from the refusal of Switzerland to give satisfaction because of an article published in a Geneva journal, in which memory of the murdered King Humbert was recalled.

Washington, April 10.—Miss Maud DeWitt Talmage, daughter of Rev. Dr. T. DeWitt Talmage, and Clarence Frederick Wyckoff, of Hingham, N. Y., were married here at the residence of the bride's parents.
