The King drag should be used without stint on the roads in this county as soon as their condition will permit its use. Last week's issue of the Elkader Register says: "This week has seen some excellent work done on the roads in this vicinity, with king drags. Reports of their use are coming in from almost every direction and the results have been simply remarkable. A large part of the streets of Elkader have been dragged and as a result are quite smooth and dry. The Garnaville and McGregor road has been dragged to the fork of the road and a long stretch on the Postville road. W. P. Urzell, in Reer township, has taken care of nearly two miles of road with fine results and similar work has been done on the Osborne and Communia roads. Let the good work go on."

Everybody knows that the earth makes one complete revolution on its axis once in each twenty-four hours, but few, however, have any idea of the high rate of speed at which such an immense ball must turn in order to accomplish the feat of making one revolution in a day at that rate. A graphic idea of the terrific pace which the old earth keeps up year after year may be had by comparing its speed to that of a cannon ball fired from a modern high pressure gun. The highest velocity ever attained by such a missile has been estimated at 1,626 feet per second, which is equal to a mile in 32.10 seconds. The earth in making one complete revolution in the short space of twenty-four hours must travel with velocity almost exactly equal to that of the cannon ball. In short, its rate of speed at the equator is exactly 1,667 feet per second. This is equal to 17 miles a minute.
