While doing so the gun was discharged the charge of shot tearing off the little fellow's right hand and entering his side. The unfortunate boy lived five hours remaining conscious to the last. The funeral was held at the Davis home on Monday afternoon and interment was made in the Pigo cemetery.—Colesburg correspondent to Earlville Phoenix.

A perplexing new disease has broken out among the cattle of George Black, a prominent farmer living north of Clearfield. The steers took sick and became crazy, wild-eyed, bellowing fearfully, and at times ran wildly through strong fences, than would whirl around and die. It ran its course in three or four hours. Drs. Redhead of Lenox and McChannahan of Redding made careful examination of the dead steers and found that the trouble was a diseased condition of the membrane covering the brain. In health the covering is pinkish, but in those examined it was streaked with black. They state the disease is not named and is incurable, but not contagious. Iowa State Register and Farmer.

The latest swindle in the line of advertising fads is that of getting out a directory of rural notes, and if anyone comes around here with such a scheme, merchants as well as farmers should give him the cold shoulder. The sharper goes to the farmers to get names and then to the merchants for ads in his directory, telling all who refuse to advertise that the rural note patrons will boycott them. In this way he gets a good many ads. The sharper afterwards distributes the directories among the merchants, who can use them for ornaments or posters, and at the same time he sells the rural note for a mail order house. The scheme is a shrewd one, but it will not work in Marion, for the merchants will be on the lookout.—Marion Sentinel.

Deputy Fish Warden Green is again after the law breakers who persist in taking fish in an unlawful manner from the Maquoketa River. This time he hauled Grant Beckwith and his fourteen year old son before Squire Babcock on fifty counts for unlawful seining of fish below Ely's dam. Beckwith lives on a rented farm in the southern part of Washington township and his whole property would have been insufficient to have paid a fine on each of the fifty different counts in which he was charged with seining fish. He pleaded guilty to ten counts and paid fifty dollars and costs which amounted to over sixty dollars more. The seine found in his possession was burned by the Deputy.—Monticello Express.

Mr. Simpson, the promoter of the inter-urban project, from Davenport has given out the fact that he has decided by those who have the affairs of the enterprise in hand, to go to Manchester instead of Dyersville as was his original intention. As is well known to our readers the line was to be built via Tipton and Monticello, thence to Hopkinton and Dyersville, seeking connection with the trunk lines there. The line was the source of considerable argument in regard to its merits locally. Hopkinton like Monticello was desirous to have a competitive line of some kind to their present line, but in the event of the terminus being at Manchester, Hopkinton will be left at the north a number of miles. However it is stated that the citizens of that place do not intend to let their opportunities for brick and tile industries and stone quarries lie dormant and are considering connection with another line through Anamosa. It is stated that the decision reached by the promoters in regard to the Davenport line is final and the curtain has been rung down on the project as far as Dyersville is concerned.—Dyersville Commercial.

THE REAL VALUE.

How All Literature is Contained in a Few Great Books.

Young people must every now and then hunt a read or see a writer but all the real value in literature can be put upon a small shelf—that is to say, the really important part of all that is written is contained in a very few good books, all the rest being either unimportant or different ways of saying the same things that have been said before. The statement, of course, is not true if it is taken literally. There are certainly many hundreds, perhaps thousands, of books that contain original thoughts or experiences that are truly valuable; but, generally speaking, the best part of all that has been written is to be found in a few volumes. To understand how this is possible you must remember that nearly all rules are the same as other and simpler rules. In arithmetic, for example, the whole science consists of only four simple ways of treating numbers. We can add, subtract, multiply and divide, and that is all we do do to numbers. The rest of the book is only the working out of these four rules; thus all of the arithmetic could easily be put into a little page that one could carry in the vest pocket.

All behavior, no right living, is also set forth in a few simple laws. These illustrations will show what is meant by saying that all literature is contained in a few great books. The Bible and the works of a few famous poets and essayists contain all human wisdom, and these are within the reach of every purse.—St. Nicholas.
