James Potts was born in Bedford county, Pennsylvania, May 11, 1833. He came with his parents to Iowa in 1846 and in the spring of 1852 crossed the plains of California in company with J. C. Moreland and others from Colesburg. He spent his early years in California, Oregon and Idaho and in the spring of 1865 returned to Iowa and located in Colesburg. About this time Mr. Potts was united in marriage with Miss Mary Malvin, who resided a few miles from Colesburg. Three sons, Frank, Harvey and John were born to them. After residing in Colesburg for a time he and his family removed to Greeley, where they lived for a number of years. He was employed as traveling salesman for the Bradley & Metcalf Boot and Shoe Co., of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for nineteen years and on account of superior railroad facilities removed to Charles City where his wife died in September 1885. In August 1887 he was united in marriage with Miss Susan Harwood of Charles City, whose goodness and devotion filled his declining years with happiness. A year ago last August, he in company with his wife removed to Los Gatos, California, where he died March 29, 1909. Early in December, Mr. Potts suffered a stroke of paralysis from which he partially recovered and for a time his friends had hopes of his ultimate recovery but in January, he suffered another attack and gradually grew weaker until the end came. He is survived by his wife and two sons, Frank and John—Harvey having died a few years ago. Two brothers also survive—John C. of Kingman, Arizona and George P. of this place. His son John accompanied his remains to Charles City arriving there early Saturday morning. Interment was made in Riverside cemetery of that city, the Knights Templar having charge of the service assisted by the pastor of the Christian church. The casket was covered with beautiful flowers—tributes of love from Los Gatos and Charles City friends. Mr. Potts as a neighbor kind and charitable; as a husband and father, tender and affectionate.

"But he sleeps in death. No more for him, the smiling and the weeping; His smiles, his tears are done. For him no more, the sowing and the reaping; His prize, his crown is won. Beyond our touch, beyond our sight forever, Beyond the gifts that loving hands have wrought, Beyond all power we hope to bind or sever; But not thank God, ah not, beyond our thought."
