
Immune to Snake Poison.

The remarkable combats of the Indian mongoose with venomous snakes, in which it always comes off victor, are well known. The fact that it invariably survives has led to the suggestion that it is immune to snake poison. Other animals said to be immune are the pig and the hedgehog.


With regard to the mongoose, indeed, and if bitten it is said to fall a victim as readily as other animals. If this be true, the London Globe says, then it must owe its victories to its wonderful agility in avoiding the bites of the reptile. However this may be, some recent experiments of M. G. Ballard show that an animal of the domestic family must be added to the list of the immune.

This animal is known as the lerot and is said to fight fiercely with vipers. Mr. Ballard injected large doses of viper's poison into the lerot and found that no ill effects followed. On one occasion, again, one of them was bitten badly on the eye by a viper, and no signs of poisoning followed. There can, then, be no doubt that the lerot is immune to snake poison.

TRADE IN HUMAN HAIR GROWING

Demands of Fashion Create Profitable Industry in German Cities.

Owing to demands of fashion, German imports and exports of human hair have increased greatly during the last year. Exports of human hair were 112.4 metric tons, of 2,204.8 pounds each, in 1908, and 136 tons in 1909, while the exports increased from 33.3 to 64.1 tons. Germany imported from China 58.7 tons of hair in 1909, and 48.2 tons from Austria the same year. An idea of the vast quantity of hair indicated by these figures may be obtained by remembering that the average weight of a full growth of hair from the head of a healthy woman in the prime of life is about half a pound. Chinese hair is the most abundant and, therefore, the cheapest. White hair is the most valuable, old people seldom possessing a full growth. Hair from China undergoes a complicated chemical and mechanical process to make it thinner, and is bleached and dyed.

High prices charged for human hair have led to the introduction of many substitutes, chiefly vegetable fibers, but seldom are these sufficiently flexible to be successful imitations.

Need of a Public Defender.

To give the poor and ignorant citizens the same chance for acquittal as the rich and powerful, Samuel Untermyer, the noted New York jurist, advocated at the recent meeting of the Social and Political Science Academy in Philadelphia the provision of a public defender as well as a public prosecutor. He asserted that upward of 100,000 people are in prison, and especially among the poor and helpless, and are "far more frequent than we fortuitously care to admit." This is especially true where the accused are too poor to furnish bail or employ counsel. Untermyer said that the great evil of the present system of criminal law is that it is not a system of justice, and that perjury is committed in three trials out of five, but is rarely punished, owing to the severity of the penalties.

Doyle's Elitist of Life.

Confirmation of the reported discovery by Dr. Doyle, the famous Paris physician, has been called from the doctor himself. He says that the substance, which he called "phosphoric acid," is available to duly authenticated American physicians for test and experiment if they apply through the American Embassy at Paris. Dr. Doyle has further that four weeks will suffice to convince the doctors of the value of this discovery provided the experiments are conducted intelligently and faithfully and not with incurables who are already near death. He asserts positively that his discovery will prolong human life from fifteen to twenty years, and that the most diseased of the respiratory organs and digestive tract will disappear, also cancer of the skin. Mycolysis, which is a word meaning "to melt," is composed of colloids which are fine particles of insoluble substances, but how derived the doctor does not say, but indicates that these are the ferments of the body which have the quality of causing rapid destruction of poisonous microbes by increasing their activity. It is in the pus (phagocytes), which act as natural scavengers and destroy the disease microbes. Then, their work done, the phagocytes disappear.

Nash's Flood Record Doubtful.

During the session of the American Oriental Society in Baltimore, Prof. G. A. Barton, of Bryn Mawr, questioned the accuracy of the record of the discovery of Prof. Hilprecht, of the University of Pennsylvania, of a tablet from the famous "temple library" of Nippur containing a portion of the Bible narrative. He gave out a translation of it, which Barton says is largely imaginary. The tablet is of unbaked clay, measuring 2 1/2 by 2 1/2 inches and nearly a fourth of an inch thick. It is broken away. It bears no date, but internal evidence places it beyond 2005 B. C. The inscription is understood to contain a list of the names of the Babylonian deluge story. Hilprecht called it the oldest known reference to the flood in writing, the tablet being at least 1,600 years older than the Bible narrative.
