PRESIDENT WILSON DISAVOWS ENMITY TO COMMERCIAL INTERESTS OF COUNTRY.

PARTY DOES NOT ANTAGONIZE

Chief Executive in Statement Defends Paul M. Warburg and T. J. Jones, Federal Reserve Bank Board Appointees—Tells Senate to Confirm.

Washington, July 10.—President Wilson came to the defense of Paul M. Warburg in a vigorous statement issued on Wednesday, in which he outlined his attitude toward the business of the country.

It would be entirely unfair to the Democratic party and to the senate itself to regard it as the enemy of business, big or little. I am sure that it does not regard a man as an object of suspicion merely because he has been connected with the federal reserve board.

I predict with the greatest confidence that nothing done by the Democratic majority of the senate of the United States will be done to throw suspicion upon Mr. Jones and Mr. Warburg.

The president's statement is taken to mean that he will fight to the last ditch for the confirmation of both Jones and Warburg.
