Mr. Peck read a paper on school grading. He thought this was the most important as well as latest of the topics of the school board. It is difficult to do at the start; requires labor and patience, and is discouraging to the pupil.

Mr. Peck thought in the country district the grade could not be carried out. He had tried it, and tried it earnestly. He had lost five pupils by his first day's attempt, and had, after a fair trial, stopped it. His school was now ungraded.
