

THE PORT OF WILMINGTON.

The whole truth in regard to this port has never been fairly given to the people. Having no journal of her own to present her claims to the public, she has fallen a prey to the envy and jealousy of other parts. We are sorry to record the fact, that the press is too prone to deal with the disagreeable features of all things. How different the life of humanity would look, if instead of publishing all the sad and evil things committed by the worst type of our race, a faithful record of all the noble, honest, and benevolent actions were given. The same is true of any city or country. There is much that is really desirable and pleasant in and around Wilmington. But the attention of the public has never been directed to it. They have a beautiful bay for pleasure excursions, they have a sea beach of eight miles, unsurpassed on the Pacific coast, indeed we do not know of any superior for carriage driving and sea bathing, except it be at Galveston, Texas. There is a small mountain northwest of the city that cuts off the strong, chilly sea winds, and gives them a delightful, balmy atmosphere, making it one of the most agreeable places for a seaside residence on this coast. But none of these pleasant features are ever mentioned by the press, and why? Because Santa Barbara, San Buenaventura, and San Diego are jealous. It is time to stop this strife. Wilmington is our port, and the natural outlet to Los Angeles county and a large territory back of us, and it is the duty as well as the best interest of this city and country to untiedly demand it can be built up an important shipping port at that place.

But we are met with the objection that "it is in the hands of a monopoly, and stands in the way of our interests. In the first place Gen. Banning, Cleburne & Co. have established a system of extortion by lightering, and charge three prices for every thing that passes that way, and that for lumber, merchandise, produce and travel, this county pays an annual tribute to that concern of over \$2000,000." There is too much truth in this. But the spirit of anti-monopoly is strong enough now for the people to assert their right, and force such men out of the way.

The Government of the United States, recognizing the importance of this harbor to Commerce, have begun and will continue to appropriate funds to make it a good and safe harbor, if we will untiedly demand it. We are informed that there is nearly \$100,000, yet left of the former appropriation. Let that be expended in dredging the channel, and in three months the "Orinaba" and "Michigan" will land at the wharf, and meet the cars. The fact is, this is our only hope for a harbor. If we foolishly go to work to run the railroad out to Dead Man's Island, or build a road to "Shooby," we will only be opening a road to stand at best. At Wilmington we can have a safe harbor—a beautiful bay, and the most prosperous shipping port in Southern California, if our people will untiedly demand it. We may as well say to the monopolist, "You are numbered, dry up your cursed monopoly; the people will not stand tansany longer. If you are disposed to act for the good of the people, we now give you a chance, but if you undertake to keep up this extortion, you may look out for trouble!" More anon. PATIENCE.

COLLEGE HAZING.—Yesterday, the first Monday of the college year at Harvard, goes among the collegians by the name of "Bloody Monday," as it is the day on which the severest hazing of the freshmen is prosecuted by the sophomores. The cruel and unmanly abuse of the unsophisticated boys who have just become members of the college, is often carried to extremes which is a disgrace to the college and to human nature, and there is no line of argument in favor which can palliate, much less vindicate it. We call to mind one instance of hazing on "Bloody Monday" which is admirably and sweetly touching as such instances are generally revolting and disgraceful. It occurred, if we remember correctly, in 1862. It was noticed by two sophomores that two country boys had begun their housekeeping in a room on the ground floor of one of the college halls, with a miserable apology for a bed, no carpet, no table, two chairs, a lamp, a bookcase, a stove, etc., and in their closet they found provisions for several days. This was hazing to a blessed purpose. We fear that the example stands almost or quite alone. [New Bedford Mercury.


