STOCKTON, Dec. 12. The man arrested by Sheriff Cunningham on the 10th, and supposed to be Tibuselo Vasquez, the noted desperado and Tres Rinos murderer, was this morning discharged from custody.

HAVANA, Dec. 11. Captain-General Jovellar, this evening, issued an address to the inhabitants of Cuba stating: "The moment a treaty is issued between the Government of Spain and the United States, my duty, however painful it may be, is to comply faithfully with its terms."
