General Howard Declared an Innocent Man.

General Howard's Innocence.

WASHINGTON, May 15.—The President is still awaiting the complete printing of the record of the Court-martial in General Howard's case, but it is certain that the Court was unanimous upon all matters affecting his character as an officer and gentleman; also, in commending his conduct as Commissioner, his complete innocence is established.

The President Comes to the Relief of Baxter.

WASHINGTON, May 15.—The President has issued a proclamation, which is telegraphed to Little Rock. The proclamation sets forth that certain disorderly and turbulent persons have combined together to resist with force of arms the authority of Baxter as Governor of Arkansas; that Baxter has been declared and duly elected by the Legislature, the only competent authority, called on the President to protect the State from domestic violence; that both Houses and a General Assembly convened by Baxter have also made a similar request of the President, and the President, being authorized by the Constitution and laws of the United States to render assistance asked in such cases and to command the dispersing of such insurgents; the President therefore now issues his proclamation, commanding all turbulent and disorderly persons to disperse and retire peacefully to their respective homes within ten days, and hereafter submit themselves to the laws and authority of the Executive and other Constitutional authorities of the State.

Washington News.

WASHINGTON, May 15.—President Grant has not yet decided whether the Federal Government has the right to interfere in the Arkansas trouble. The Finance bill passed the Senate. The Deficiency bill, passed by the House, appropriates \$625,000 for collecting and subsisting the Apaches for two years past.

SAN FRANCISCO.

The Robber of Gov. Pico Confesses His Guilt—Pool Selling on the Great Race—Liquor Dealers and Local Option—Mate of the Steamer Whipple Killed.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 15.—

Weather warm and pleasant. W. J. Alford, the man who robbed Gov. Pico of about fifteen hundred dollars, has confessed his guilt.

Pool selling at the Lick House last night on the match race between "Dexter" and "Ella Lewis" was very brisk, with the odds in favor of "Lewis" \$100 to \$75.

The race comes off to-morrow, and more pools will be sold to-night.

Hall McAllister has been employed by the combination of wholesale liquor dealers to contest in the courts the constitutionality of the Local Option law.

Mr. Creighton, mate of the S. M. Whipple, was caught this afternoon between the vessel's masts and some part of the boat and crushed to death.

Philip Folks, President of the Page and Panacea Mining Company, was arrested to-day on the complaint of Geo. Sharp, accusing him of having embezzled the money of the company. His bail was fixed at \$4,000.

The jury in the case of Mrs. Gersbach was discharged last night, after having been out over fifty hours, no verdict being rendered. They stood six for acquittal and six for conviction.
