Pacific Coast Items.

Three fights in thirty minutes are reported to have taken place at Knight's Landing last Sunday.

About 15,000 tons of wheat is stored at Knight's Landing, available at that point at \$1.30 per cental.

S. O. Gunning, foreman of the Excelsior mine at Sucker Flat, had a leg and two ribs broken on Friday by the caving of a bank.

The total amount of wheat now stored in Stockton is 58,228 tons. It is estimated that the season will close with about 70,000 tons in warehouse.

United States Surveyor-General Stratton, with Deputy Norman, started on Friday from San Diego for Julian in connection with the survey of the Cuyamaca grant.
