Pacific Coast Items.

The Marysville Appeal says some speculators recently made a corner on potatoes in that city.

The water in Mono lake is reported as tasting something like soap-suds and something like sea-water.

The Stockton tannery on Wednesday, shipped five tons of leather to San Francisco en route to Yokohama.

The Widow Haynes ranch of 1,000 acres, near Briggs' station, in Butte county, was sold a few days since for \$30,000.

Seventy-nine flasks of quicksilver were dispatched from the Great Western Mine, in Napa county, on Thursday last.

B. B. Fuller was arrested at Fresno last week and convicted of carrying on a lottery by selling prize jewelry boxes.

The citizens of St. Helena are indignant because the public school houses are used at night for the purpose of educating Chinamen.

Many of the orchardists in the Western portion of the Santa Clara valley, within the region of the warm belt, will this year set out almond and orange trees.

According to the Vallejo Chronicle, the Vallejo foundry has secured the job of doing all the iron work for a San Francisco firm engaged in the manufacture of gas-motors.

A coroner's jury in Lassen county, considering the case of a man killed by lightning, rendered the following verdict: "He was killed by the Lord, but no blame is attached to the matter."

D. O. Mills & Co. surrendered to the State Controller for redemption, Friday, civil bonds of \$357 to the amount of \$5,623 31, and S. J. Nathan surrendered similar bonds to the amount of \$4,066 96.

The Mexican desperado, Ramon Quiroz who was shot at Modesto, last week, by Uncle Sheriff Aull while attempting to arrest him, died at the Stanislaus County Jail last Monday morning about 3 o'clock.

A meeting was held at Suisun on Tuesday last, to devise ways and means for co-operating with the residents of Heressa valley in the construction of a narrow-gauge railroad, between Suisun City, Solano county, and Knoxville, Napa county.

General Frisbie has signed a deed conveying to the city of Vallejo the block of land known as the City Park. The gift is accompanied by the condition that the land shall not be used for any purpose but that of a park. Otherwise it is to revert to the estate of the donor.

Articles of incorporation of the Sonoma and Marin Railroad Company were filed in the office of the Secretary of State on Tuesday. Principal place of business, Petaluma; capital stock, \$100,000, in shares of \$100 each. Also, of the Santa Cruz and Felton Railroad Company; principal place of business San Jose; capital stock \$1,000,000, in shares of \$100 each.

The San Jose Mercury says: The last Legislature somewhat grudgingly appropriated the necessary funds for sustaining the State Normal School upon an estimated basis of one hundred and fifty students—that being the average number there in attendance. It has now reached two hundred and sixty, and the number is increasing daily, and the principal is trying to solve the conundrum how to make the appropriation answer for the increased number of scholars.
