Grape Crushing.

The season of wine making has fairly commenced, and the whirl of the crushers is heard in the land.

Prominent among the grape crushers is Don Mateo Keller, on Alameda street, near Aliso, who has forty pickers engaged and six teams running constantly, loaded with the product of his own vineyards.
