ANECDOTE OF TRISTRAM BURGESS.

Oliver H. Smith, of Indiana, in one of his reminiscences, published in the Indianapolis Journal, tells the following story:

During the debate in Congress on the tariff, in 1828, an amendment was offered to increase the duty on molasses ten cents per gallon; being an increase of a hundred per cent. The object was to check the vote of the northern members, and indirectly to kill the bill. When the House was in committee of the whole, Mr. Burgess, of R. I., arose and implored the member to withdraw it. He showed its effects upon the trade between the eastern States and the adjacent islands, in timber and the return cargoes of molasses which was the daily food of the poor. His speech was short and to the point. As he took his seat, Henry Daniel, of Kentucky, sprang to his feet and roared out at the top of his voice, "Mr. Chairman, let the constituents of the gentleman from Rhode Island see they will pay the duties they do now." Mr. Burgess rose in reply, and said, "Now look up, Tristram, Harry will catch it!" Mr. Burgess arose with fire beaming from his countenance, and addressed the chair. "The relief proposed by the gentleman from Kentucky is but adding insult to injury. Does not that gentleman know that established habits become second nature and that laws are cruel and oppressive that strike at the innocent habits of the people? To illustrate: what would they think of me if I should offer an amendment that himself or his constituents shall hereafter have no more than a pint of whiskey for breakfast instead of a quart? Does he not know that the disposition of all animals partakes, in a greater or less degree, of the food on which they are reared? The horse is noble, kind, and grateful; he is fed on grain and grass, and the bear (looking at Daniel, who was a heavy, short man dressed in a blue coat, with a velvet collar) will eat hog and raw hominy.— You can domesticate him, dress him in a blue coat with a velvet collar, learn him to stand erect, and to imitate the human voice as some showmen have done, but examine him closely, sir, (looking at Daniel some seconds) you will discover he is a bear still! The gentleman told us in a speech some days ago, that his district produced a large number of jackasses, hogs and mules. No stronger proof of the truth of his statement can be given than a look at his representative.

Daniel walked towards the speaker, and a few members afterwards felt disposed to arouse the eminent son of Rhode Island.

RECOVERY OF CHILDREN.

CAN A MAN WILL HIS CHILDREN OUT OF THE CUSTODY OF THEIR MOTHER?—Some days since application was made to Judge Williams, for a writ of habeas corpus, by P. C. Shannon, esq. on behalf of Margaretta Hamilton, widow of the late George S. Hamilton, for the recovery of her three children, who have since the death of their father, been held in custody by his two brothers, Samuel and Fulton Hamilton. The writ was made returnable on Saturday, the 13th inst., when the case came up in the District Court. It appeared that the brothers-in-law of Mrs. Hamilton retained the children by virtue of a will of her husband, which provided for and appointed for each of the children separate guardians. Mr. Shannon, on behalf of the mother, demanded that the children should be restored to the mother, who in case of the father's decease is the next natural guardian; and that no law, human or divine, can separate her from them, as long as she is able and willing to support and care for them.

In opposition to the application, it is argued that the will of the father should be binding; and that he had a perfect right to make such provision for the future training of his children, as he deemed proper. The Legislature empowers a father to make a will, and it would be a gross violation of the spirit of the law, to annul such documents, so long as no legal objections could be taken to them.
