BY MAGNETIC TELEGRAPH. Letter from Nicaragua. New York, Dec. 11.—The steamer Washington from Nicaragua, arrived here this forenoon. She reached San Juan on the 18th November, and found in port the American frigate Savannah, and ship-of-war Jamestown; also the British ships Leopard and Valorous...

Nothing had been heard of the Hermann on the Pacific side. The Nicaraguan Government refused permission to land the passengers of the Washington, alleging that they were filibusters. The steamer Catherine Maria was, however, sent to Grenada to obtain permission to land the passengers if the Hermann had arrived.

The Washington was boarded by the officers of the British, who asked to see the passenger list, and also for information as to whether she had munitions of war on board; but they did not insist on raising the hatchets, and then left suddenly. Boats from the Leopard then went to the mouth of the Colorado to intercept 250 men, who were reported to have landed there from the Washington on the previous night.

The government, however, became finally satisfied that there were no filibusters on the Washington or the Hermann, and the steamer was permitted to land in Virgin Bay. The agent of the company then proceeded to San Juan to look after the Hermann. No orders having come for the passengers of the Washington to go forward by the mail route, they remained on board and returned to New York. [An evident hiatus occurs here in the dispatches.—R. P.]

Our boat could not get up the San Juan, owing to the low water, and proceeded to the mouth of the Colorado, where she arrived at daylight the next morning, just in time to be seen by the Leopard.

She was chased by the boats from the Leopard with a view to small arms; but on overtaking the Hermann, she fired at her, and they went back to their ship, which returned to Greytown on the 25th. The schooner arrived at Greytown with the information that the Hermann had proceeded direct to San Francisco.
