POSTSCRIPT.

BY MAGNETIC TELEGRAPH. EXCITEMENT AT CHARLESTON. The following dispatch was received by Wm. D. Massey, Mayor of this city, yesterday afternoon...

HARPER'S FERRY, Nov. 17, 1859. Mayor of Alexandria—I have just received from Col. Day, in charge of Harper's Ferry, a letter from which I subjoin the following extract:

It is proper to add, I know nothing of his necessity, but the express man who brought this, says, there are two hundred and fifty men, with Sharp's rifles, encamped at Berryville, Ford, I know nothing.

The Riflemen immediately accepted the call, telegraphed to Mr. Barbour that they would be up in the first train, and were to have left this morning at 4 o'clock for Charleston.

Fires in Georgia. AUGUSTA, Nov. 17.—Last night, at Atlanta, six new stores in Whitehall street were destroyed by fire. The estimated loss is about \$100,000. Two children were also burnt.

At the same time, in the town of Griffin, six fine stores on Main street, and a warehouse containing 400 bales of cotton were also burnt. Loss \$75,000.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Intelligence has been received here that the steamship North Star, from New York on the 20th ult., bound for Aspinwall, got ashore when five days out, on the French Keys, where she remained seven days. She finally succeeded in getting off without assistance, and proceeded on her voyage on the 24th inst.
