OLD ABE'S QUALIFICATIONS.—First, "Old Abe" was born in Kentucky, somewhere about the year 1809. That is his first qualification. Many other men were born in Kentucky, about the same time, and to this ground have an equal claim to the Presidency. Second, "Old Abe" emigrated to Illinois with his axe on his shoulder. Other men emigrated to Illinois with axes on their shoulders, and in this regard, are equally qualified with "Old Abe" for the Presidency. Third, "Old Abe," it is said, (that probably it is a fiction,) has split rails. Thousands of men have split rails, and, consequently, are deserving of the Presidency, if rail splitting is a qualification for that high office. Fourth, "Old Abe" went down the Mississippi in a flat-bottom boat. Any number of the "Hosiers," and "Suckers," have been down the Mississippi river in flat-bottomed boats, and consequently ought to be Black Republican candidates. Fifth, "Old Abe," says, "But he did not kill any Black Hawk." But he did kill an Indian or a nigger, the game would have been up with him, so far as getting the Presidency from the Black Republicans. They don't hold to killing the enemies of their country. But "Abe" was not alone in the Black Hawk war. Many others were there, and brave men too, about whom the country has heard something, before the lapse of a quarter of a century, as is the case with "Abe." Yet, they were never thought of for the Presidency. "Old Abe" got terribly thrashed by Douglas in the campaign of 1858, and to this important fact he owed all his celebrity, and his nomination for the Presidency. Other men have been whipped by Douglas, and therefore will make good Black Republican candidates for that high office. Seventh, "Old Abe" has been, and probably is, now, a pretty hard whiskey drinker. *En Passant*, we hear that Douglas says no man in Illinois has used so much hard whiskey as himself except "Abe Lincoln." A Kentucky man, an Illinoisian, a Scotchman, don't love old Bourbon. Get out of that to the marines. But it is a good qualification for a Black Republican President—a party which supports Maine liquor laws, merely to cover the drinking and selling of spirituous liquors. Eight, "Old Abe" is the ugliest looking man in the United States. There are good many ugly looking men in the United States; but ugliness was never before regarded as a qualification for Presidency. Show them his picture, and there is not a woman in an American city who will advocate his election. But "Abe's" ugliness is considered by the Black Republicans as a good qualification for the Presidency. Above we have given pretty much all the arguments that have been seriously advanced, by the Black Republican press, in favor of the election of "Abe" Lincoln to the Presidency of the United States. — *Bell's Falls Advertiser.*

THE VOLUNTEER FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES AND ENGLAND.—The recent rally review of British volunteers in Hyde Park, has attracted much attention to the citizen soldiers of Great Britain, and the fact that 15,000 of these volunteers passed in review before the Queen, shows how effective have been the Governmental measures adopted during the last fifteen months, for the encouragement of these organizations. The volunteers must not be confounded with the militia, which is a separate arm of the military establishment. On the 1st of April, the militia numbered 50,000. On the 1st of Government statistics, 50,000. Of these, 27,755 were embodied, England contributing 17,580, Ireland 7,471, and Scotland 2,684. The two are as distinct as here. The total strength of the British volunteer force is estimated at about 90,000, making, together with the militia, about 150,000, of which number, according to the Army Gazette, at least 20,000 would, from various causes, prove unavailable in case of need, so that about 130,000 men constitute the whole effective militia and volunteer force of England. We have an official data showing the total volunteer force of the United States, but the exact estimates place it in the neighborhood of 80,000, while the number of enrolled militia, as reported to the War Department, exceeds two and a half millions. There is a very wide difference, however, in the encouragement extended to volunteers in England and the United States. The chief expense of the English forces is defrayed by the Government, while with us the General Government scarcely recognizes the existence of these very important organizations, and the State and extended to them in salary and manure. Even the expenses of military equipment for the collection in field duty are compensated for by the several companies. The Seventh Regiment of New York Volunteers, now in camp near that city, is maintained at an annual cost of not less than \$50,000, and the expenses of the present encampment are estimated at \$12,000, of which is borne by the Regiment. — *Poughkeepsie.*
