THREE DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE.

Arrival of the Jura.

FURTHER POINT, Sept. 17.—The steunship Jura (substituted for the Canadian) passed here this forenoon, dropping dispatches for the Associated Press.

The Persia, the Parma, and the Edinburgh had arrived out.

The news is unimportant, Garibaldi and his forces had reached the mainland, and were expected at Naples immediately.

The King of Naples was to leave for Gaeta on the 6th. Eight Sardinian frigates were in the Bay of Naples on the 8th, with two regiments.

More massacres had been reported at Balbeo and other places in the interior of Syria.

It is reported that Napoleon assured M. Farina of his sincere desire to see Italy independent, and that Victor Emanuel and Sicily will be strong enough to contend against Austria; but that should the latter prove victorious, France would not allow her to abuse the victory.

It is reported that the Austrian Minister to Naples had telegraphed to Vienna that the King of Naples had resolved to quit Naples.

All the pictures and furniture of the palace and the King's baggage were embarked on board a Spanish vessel.

LATEST.—Garibaldi arrived in Salerno, on the 6th. He was expected at Naples immediately.

It is rumored that the King would leave instantly for Gaeta.

Two members of the British Parliament and one Englishman were on board a Sardinian vessel, on a visit to Garibaldi with a message from Lord Palmerston, deprecating an immediate attack upon Rome or Veitina as compromising Garibaldi's success.

Another Line of Battle ship had left Toulon for Naples.

Sardinia has stationed 20,000 troops on the Roman Frontiers in consequence of a certain proclamation of Gen. Lamoriciere.
