

John C. Rives, esq., the veteran editor and politician, died at his residence near Washington, yesterday, in the 69th year of his age.—The deceased was well known as one of the late firm of Blair & Rives, the publishers of the Washington Globe, the government organ during Gen. Jackson's administration, and more recently as the sole proprietor of the same paper, its columns being devoted to the publication of the official debates of Congress.

About forty guerillas entered Shelbyville, Ky., on the morning of the 8th instant, and took seven horses from Middleton's stables, and broke open the Branch Bank of Ashland, but at the proximity of the 12th Ohio cavalry they retired.

A despatch from Fortress Monroe, from the paymaster of the frigate Minnesota, dated on Sunday says: "Topedo hit us last night; all safe and right side up this morning."
