The receipts at the office of internal revenue in Washington, from July 1st to the end of November last five months, were \$157,028,104.69. In the receipts for these five months is included the income tax for the entire current fiscal year. The receipts therefore for the remaining seven months will be very materially less pro rata than in the above specified months. It is safe to say that considerably more than one-half the receipts for the entire fiscal year will be found to be embraced in the aggregate for the five months above specified. The amount of the receipts for the year will not exceed \$275,000,000 and may fall short of that sum.
