**THE CASE OF GEN. BRADLEY T. JOHNSON.**  
It was mentioned last week, that Gen. Bradley T. Johnson, late of the Confederate army, had been arrested in Baltimore, by the United States Marshal, to answer an indictment for treason, &c., found by a jury of the United States Court, and that after his arrest he was bailed in the sum of \$20,000, for his appearance before the United States Circuit Court, next week. After giving bail, Mr. Johnson visited Washington and had an interview with Lieut. Gen. Grant, claiming that under this convention entered into between Generals Sherman and Johnson, he was exempt from arrest and molestation according to the terms of his parole. This interview resulted in the discharge from arrest of Gen. B. T. Johnson, and the exoneration of his bail people, which was done on Thursday morning in the United States Circuit Court, before Judge Giles, upon the motion of William J. Jones, esq., United States District Attorney. The following is the correspondence which took place at Washington, in relation to the matter:

**LETTER OF LIEUTENANT GENERAL GRANT, HEADQUARTERS ARMIES OF THE U. S., WASHINGTON, D. C. April 2, 1866.**

To His Excellency, A. Johnson, President of the United States:  
Sir—I would respectfully request that Bradley T. Johnson, late a General in the Rebel army, be released from the bonds under which he is now held by the State of Maryland, for the part he took in the battle of Gettysburg, as I understand, in 1863.

B. T. Johnson was paroled under the Convention between Generals Sherman and Johnson. At the time of his indictment, he was in the State of Maryland, by authority from their headquarters.
