A HORSE THIEF ESCAPES.—Three men rode into Falmouth on Thursday, well armed, in pursuit of a colt that had been stolen from Vienna, Loudoun county, the day before. The thief had been tracked from point to point until they reached Falmouth.

The party rode up near the thief, who was mounted, with the colt halted, and inquired if there was an owner in the place. One of the party then claimed the colt, which the fellow said he had purchased the day before, and said he would bring proof. Getting a few rods off from the party he put spurs to his steed, threw himself flat on the neck of the horse, and dashed off a la war. Although a few shots were fired after him, and the thief got off, going down the river road, and is doubtless somewhere in the Northern Neck.

Riding seventy miles, tracking and coming up to the thief, and then managing to let the one man escape from three, is not very creditable engineering.—Fredericksburg Herald.

The Cincinnati Gazette announces that "pure essence of coffee" is now made in that city out of the "cheapest, dirtiest molasses." This molasses is boiled, cooled, and when hard is broken up and pulverized. Ground rye is then mixed with it, and a small box of the mixture, labelled "pure essence of coffee," is sold for eighty cents.
