When assured that all Virginians would cordially welcome intelligent British emigrants, for whose character we entertained a high regard, he seemed to be much gratified, and more anxious than ever to come amongst us. Before our conversation was closed he had to leave and abruptly end it. In consideration of the above facts, ought we not to adopt some system to make known our feelings and wishes amongst the subjects of Queen Victoria? HANOVER.
