MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS.

From all reliable quarters come contradictions of the fabrications of Radical adventurers that have been South, who, having no means, nor good sense, nor, perhaps, manners, get up statements for the political market, reciting that Southern men cannot live in the South. So far as Maryland and Virginia are concerned, we have most reliable assurances to the contrary.

An angry and excited discussion occurred in the Senate last week between Senators Sherman and Fessenden, which more than once required the interference of the President. Mr. Sherman was anxious to press the loan funding bill. Mr. Fessenden and, it seems, other members of the Committee on Finance, are violently opposed to this measure.

The House of Representatives manifests a disposition to impose a tax of five cents a pound on cotton, producing forty millions. It is estimated that Mr. Morrill's scheme, although requiring taxation to the amount of seventy-five millions, will yield a surplus revenue of a hundred millions.

The monetary disturbances which have lately occurred in England has had no effect here, except to advance the gold premium to a fraction over thirty and to cause an exportation of three or four millions in gold. Prices of United States securities are maintained here.

It has been proposed to increase the distillery licenses ten-fold, as a preventive of fraud. The fact that whiskey is sold in some commercial depots at a price less than the tax is an evidence that the present law cannot be enforced.

The New York Evening Post rebukes its partisan cotemporaries for their attempt to stir up ill-feeling against the Southern people on account of this State's disturbance.

COOKERY SCIENTIFICALLY TREATED.—Professor Eliot, a famous authority in culinary matters, has been giving illustrated lectures on cookery in Boston, where his subject and manner of treating it attracts much attention. He cooked on the stage the dishes of which he discoursed. From a report of his third lecture, published in the Boston Post, we extract some general observations which will be found interesting and useful by the ladies:

A omelet may be made more flaky by being set in the oven as soon as done.
Never bring fat to the table.
Potatoes, when cut into thin slips like a pencil, make them potatoes Francaise.
The quicker broth cools the longer it will keep.

Many people mistake rich food for high-seasoned food. Rich food is healthy; high-seasoned food is unhealthy. Rich food is not stimulating; hot food is stimulating.
In summer make broth every other day. In baking meat, no matter what kind, always put in some broth. The top of an oven is always the warmest. To prevent from burning grease a paper with butter and put on the top of the article baking. This will keep the top of the meat or bread as moist as the bottom. The taper prevents the steam from rising. You need only to taste the paper occasionally. Some meats require less time to bake than others. Pork and veal, to be healthy, should always be overdone.

EPIDEMIC SWINDLING.—The New York Tribune foots up the bank swindlings and embezzlements from May '65 to May '66, at about eight million one hundred and sixty-four thousand dollars, besides three million four hundred and seventy-two thousand dollars of what it calls "vulgar and violent robberies." This covers only the known case, and of the result it is said: "The text has its obvious lesson and its local application, which men of business can select for themselves." And one of the application, says an exchange, ought to be the teachings and practices of extreme radicals in the pulpit, in the press and upon the forum. When more of politics than of the Gospel preached from the pulpit and when all sorts of follies and crimes are committed in the name of liberty and righteousness, the public can expect nothing better than extensive embezzlements and robberies.
