GENERAL NEWS.

The tilting hoops have at last aroused the indignation of the clergy. Last Sunday one of the fathers connected with the church of St. Francis Xavier, in Sixteenth street New York, spoke his mind pretty freely on the subject. He admonished the female portion of his congregation that they must give them up—cease to come to the confessional. Nothing so immoral or immoral had ever been witnessed in New York before. He did not know what the fashions were at the theatre or the opera, as he did not go to such places, but he could not shut his eyes to the nuisance, as it existed before his eyes, in front of God's altar. He thought it his duty to abate it so far as the church of St. Xavier was concerned, and other churches could do as they liked.

The 1st of June is now on hand, and according to the various almanac-makers, "warm (or hot) weather may be expected about this time." Very probable; now let every one of our citizens think of this, and ask himself if he is prepared for the heated term. Cities are probably unhealthy during warm weather, simply because of the want of cleanliness, with proper attention to the sanitary condition of a city it can be made as healthy as the country.

It appears that at the capture of Columbia, South Carolina by Sherman's army, there was stolen an article of great antiquity, and highly respected by 3. C. Masons as a relic of a great age and of the past. This was the famous sword of state, called among the Masons "The Grand sword," and commonly believed among them to have been once possessed by the Lord protector of England.

The Boston Traveller states that the refusal of the part of carpenters and caulkers at that port to repair vessels which have come from New York, where a strike among ship carpenters and others has prevailed for several weeks, has excited much feeling among ship owners, who contemplate by way of retaliation, shutting down the docks and suspending all work until the New York strike is at an end.

Rev. A. T. Shaver, of the Methodist Protestant Church, died, after a protracted and painful illness, on the 19th instant, at his residence, in Bacon county, Ala., aged forty-seven. He was a native of this State, but had lived in Alabama for about fifteen years. Mr. Shaver was one of seven sons, five of whom were ministers of the Gospel.

The determination of the Emperor of Brazil to open his coasting trade to the shipping of foreign nations will, it is said, give American merchants and vessels a profitable trade with which no European country can compete.

LAW AND JUSTICE IN MASSACHUSETTS.—A man who was mobbed in that State because some children said, and said falsely, as appears, that he expressed satisfaction at Lincoln's death, recently endeavored to get damages from the Regulators, (an institution Massachusetts imported from California and introduced.) The outrage was so notorious that even a Massachusetts jury was bound to find the persecutors guilty, but as they saw nothing in the matter they made the damages nominal. The Boston Post, commenting on the case, says:

"In the course of the trial the political prejudices of most of the witnesses for the defense, as arrogant avowal of parties implicated of all the 31st in defiance of law, the ironical process of subjecting a citizen to gross insults to a public officer, sworn to defend the laws, and the world sanction what was complained of, and corresponding circumstances together with the very best instructions of the Court, and the verdict of the jury, prove that a man's property, liberty, and life have but feeble security in Massachusetts unless his opinions are so far from pleasing the ruling majority, that the offences perpetrated at Roxbury, Haverhill, Swampscott, Salem—the extraordinary interference of the Legislature in pending trials—the nominal punishments decreed and the ready obedience of the Governor—all establish the fact that law in this State is made and administered to gratify party intolerance rather than to secure impartial justice. It is here—in the Old Bay State—that we have mobs to force compliance with their will—to sit in judgment upon the property of a citizen's opinion, act or speech—to adjudge him guilty or innocent—pronounce and inflict punishment, and perpetrate any outrage upon him prejudice, enmity, or 'the fun of the thing' may prompt. This is bad seed to sow, and those who scatter it may live to reap the dragon's teeth."

SPECULATIVE TURN OF MIND.—A lady of the green-spectacled and strong-minded persuasion, from down East, near the hub of the universe was in conversation with a female friend, and was enlarging on the dear little African public she had been teaching, and was about to leave, perhaps forever (about one hundred), when one of them came in.
