THE MEMPHIS RIOT.—The Secretary of War last Wednesday, sent to the House, in compliance with a resolution of that body, the report of Gen. Stoneman in regard to the Memphis riot. "Gen Stoneman as follows:—"As before stated, the rioters were composed of the police, firemen and the rabble, and negro-haters in general, with a sprinkling of Yankee-haters, all led on and encouraged by demagogues and office hunters, and most of them under the influence of whiskey. It appears in evidence before the commission that John Creighton, recorder of the city, made a speech to the rioters, in which he said: "We are not prepared, but let us prepare to clear every negro s—of a-b—h out of town." Very few paroled Confederates were mixed up with the rioters on Tuesday and Wednesday, the larger portion being registered voters. Who composed the incendiaries on Wednesday night remains to be developed."
