THE CONDITION OF MR. DAVIS.—A correspondent of the New York Tribune, in a letter from Fortress Monroe, dated June 9th, had an interview yesterday afternoon with Dr. Cooper, the surgeon who attends upon Mr. Davis, and he assured me that it was no longer a matter of doubt that Mr. Davis' condition is improving. His muscles are soft, and he is naturally a weakly, puny man. He cannot get up stairs without the aid of a crutch, and in his walks he cannot go half across the parade without resting, but he is improving in health since the guard has been taken away from his door at night, and his face is filling up, the wrinkles are in a measure coming out.—Dr. Cooper seems to have considerable sympathy for the unfortunate condition of his patient. Soldiers and others with whom I conversed, say that Mr. Davis walks very well, and one man, who knew him before the war, tells me that he does not perceive much difference in him between then and now, except that he looks a little older. His appetite is good, and I have no doubt but that he will live for many years.
