**HENRY WARD BEECHER—RECONSTRUCTION.**  
The following is an extract from a sermon delivered by Rev. Henry Ward Beecher at the Church, N. Y., on Sunday last:  
"I am as strong as ever in the conviction that the true result of the war must be recognized. Whatever went into the Constitution or account of slavery must come out; and slavery was kept out on account of slavery. It was put into our organic law; and I have believed and labored for this as strongly, and longer than any of you. But I have felt that it should be done in the spirit of love, not of hatred. Consider the doctrines brought forward in the House of Representatives by Mr. Seward—though followed in their entirety, thank God! by few—I consider them to be the worst of evil, leading to destruction. The North had a chance to show grace, and love, and magnanimity. How I longed to see it! Both Congress and the President should have been pressed to Union. I had hoped to see the North showing her superiority in Christian nobleness and generous forgiveness. But I have been disappointed. It is not her fault. You can no more change rebels to loyalists by casting them out and turning them away, than you can convert the wicked by building up a wall of separation between them and the good—shutting them out from the very influences that should be brought to bear upon them. 'If thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink; for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head.' Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good." There, go: vote that. You have been praying it long enough: do it. You have been praying it long enough: try it.

**PROCEEDINGS OF CONGRESS.**—The Senate, yesterday adopted a resolution asking the President to communicate any information in his possession relative to the departure of Austrian troops for Mexico. The House amendments to the joint resolution respecting bounties to soldiers were concurred in, when the executive, legislative and judicial appropriation bill was taken up, various amendments were made, and the bill passed. A proposition to appropriate \$20,000,000 to pay loyal wages for slaves returned into the service of the government was offered, but withdrawn with the understanding that it would be moved to place it in the army bill.

The principal business in the House was the consideration and final action on the Senate's amendments to the joint resolution of the reconstruction committee. Mr. Stevens, of Pennsylvania, concluded the debate, when the resolution as amended by the Senate was passed—yeas 20, nays 33; so that it now goes to the legislatures of the several States for the ratification by three-fourths of them.

**JOHN COUNTY.**—The session of the June Court on Monday last, attracted an unusually large number of persons. There was a full bench of Justices, and the following laws were reported: To punish unlawful hunting, &c., forbidding all the turkeys abandoned and taking the necessary steps to take them in possession of County roads. Rejected the old Road Law passed at last session, and continuing the same, appropriating \$800 to rebuild Goose Creek Bridge at Outland Mills. Appointing commissioners to reorganize the militia, and hold elections for officers.

We are requested to state that the law extending the jurisdiction of single magistrates to \$500 has been repealed; their jurisdiction now only extended to cases of \$50.
