All could not win, but each contended hard to gain a slight victory as the one which earned the heart of Madam Chivalry, as gallantly he laid his lance at the feet of Miss Eva McTorkle—and graciously did she accept the honors of the "Oakwood Knight," as Queen of Love and Beauty. Next came A. C. Tolson, from "My Maryland," who selected Miss Nancy Thomas first maid of honor. As if to prove there's nothing in a name, "Knight Before Last," Abb Fox, just looked at Miss Mary Miller, then at the ring, and royally did she wear the crown so nobly won. The "Laurel Brigade," will be recognized by Lieut. Harrison Reid and Miss Alice Jackson, from the buried past, brought to life for many sad but pleasing reminiscences. The cholera has broken out with fearful violence in the vicinity of North Adams, Mass. There have been eight cases and five deaths, the doctors say, within twenty-two hours. Fall apples are plenty and good, and cheaper than last year, and in different sections of Massachusetts, Vermont and New Hampshire, the yield is an average one. A great proportion of the farmers will have much for their own use and some to spare.
