BISHOP WHITTINGHAM ON AMUSEMENTS.— Bishop Wm. Whittingham, of Maryland, "affectionately calls the attention of the clergy and laity of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Maryland to the following canon of the Diocese of Maryland," "declaring in his judgment that it binds the consciences of members of that Church: "Attendance upon theatrical exhibitions, horse-races, and other vain and light amusements, being considered inconsistent with the Christian character, it is hereby declared to be the duty of members of this Church, carefully to abstain from encouraging them by their presence."
