THE "HOMESTEAD PROVISION" OF THE NEW CONSTITUTION. Several gentlemen of Wytheville recently addressed a letter to James W. Sheffy and Isaac J. Leitwih, asking opinions as to the constitutionality of the provision in question. Mr. Sheffy expresses himself as follows:

The proposed exemption amounts to no exemption at all; for the debts which are required to be paid embrace, in my view, every class of liabilities except open accounts, and also embrace all accounts for any property which the debtor still holds. The only accounts against which the provision for the debtor is a protection are accounts for articles which have been consumed or disposed of. The pretended exemption is therefore a trick and a fraud, intended to mislead and deceive.

But if the exemption clause stood alone, and was not, as it is, whittled down to nothing by the provisions, it is, in my judgment, a clear violation of the prohibition in the Constitution of the U. S. It proposes to exempt from levy or sale under any execution, order, or other process issued on any demand for any debt, heretofore or hereafter contracted, property not exceeding \$2,000. Applying to debts heretofore contracted, it is a law impairing the obligation of contracts. No State can pass such a law, either by its Convention or Legislature, without violating the Constitution of the U. S.
