The Baltimore American, at this late day, talks of a cavalry regiment of Federal soldiers, that was "engaged for some time at McDonald's estate, on the York road, and indiscriminately plundered everybody in that vicinity, and waylaid people travelling up and down the road. Their conduct became so unbearable, and their discipline so bad, that before the regiment had been filled they were ordered by the authorities at Washington to one of the forts in Mobile Bay." We have no means of knowing, but we would bet a big apple, that if this regiment was spoken of at all during the war, by the American, it was in any other terms than those now employed. Most probably, these successors of "Kirke's Lambs" were praised for every thing noble, patriotic, chivalric, brave!

A letter from Salt Lake city, published in the Alta California, does not give the same flattering statement of the Mormon capital, that we frequently read in the accounts from that place. It represents the city as claiming a population of 20,000; and admitting this point, says there is not another city of equal size in any of the States which does not excel it in every particular, save its plan of irrigation; and necessarily compels this boasted incident. The writer, also, does not regard the Mormon Church and hierarchy as having any real stable foundation—affirms that the Mormons themselves are selfish, bigoted, and without elevation of views or character. We expect there is a good deal of truth in this picture.

The Scientific American argues "that the mission of cholera has terminated, and this terrible pestilence will scourge the earth no more."

We are glad to hear this upon scientific authority—but we rather incline to think if people want to terminate the "mission" spoken of, they had better rely upon attention to cleanliness, diet, &c., and the known preventives against such epidemics.

The St. Paul Pioneer thinks that General Grant has too great a "proclivity" towards accepting presents from everybody who wants to curry favor with him, or in homely phrase to lick his boots. It thinks, in his present position, he should decline the gifts and presents made to him; frequently by persons who have a mean and interested motive.

By a "fortunate" coincidence, just as the Alaska purchase is brought before Congress, information comes from that new "acquisition" of rich gold discoveries, exceeding those of the early days of California, and of vast mines of anthracite coal.

The French government has suppressed several of the Trade Societies in Paris for illegally interfering with work and wages.

**THE LEE FAMILY.**—General Lee was born in 1807, and was the fifth child of Henry Lee, the celebrated "Light Horse Harry" of the Revolution, and bears the name of his maternal uncle, Robert and Edward Carter of Shirley, the family residence of the Carters.

The founder of the Lee family was Laurence Lee, who came to England from France with William the Conqueror, and received, after the battle of Hastings, a fine estate in Essex.

The name was originally first Dr. Legu or De Le. In 1491 the name was written Lee, the representative of the family at that time being Richard Lee of Langley in the county of Shropshire.
