HISTORICAL RECORD—VIRGINIA.—By nine solemn acts, extending from the year 1861 to the present time, has Congress recognized Virginia as a State within the Union. They are as follows: as we condense them from the late able speech of Mr. G. W. Morgan, Ohio, in the House of Representatives.
By recognizing and consenting to the act of the Legislature of the State of Virginia in creating the State of West Virginia out of territory within her own jurisdiction.
By the recognition and consent of Congress to the act of the Legislature of the State of Virginia to cede the counties of Berkeley and Jefferson to the State of West Virginia.
By the act of March, 1862, whereby Virginia was entitled to eight and West Virginia to three Representatives in Congress.
By the act of August 5, 1861, whereby a direct tax of \$500,000 was apportioned to the State of Virginia.
Congress further recognized Virginia as a State while her children were fighting in opposing armies, by admitting into the Congress of the United States Senators and Representatives from the State of Virginia.

By admitting Senators and Representatives from the State of West Virginia into the Congress of the United States; for if Virginia had not been a State of the Union, then there is no such State as West Virginia, for she could only become a State by and with the consent of the State of Virginia.
Congress has submitted the proposed amendments to the Constitution—the thirteenth, fourteenth, and fifteenth—to the State of Virginia for ratification, thereby three distinct times recognizing Virginia as a State of the Union; for certain it is that a State outside of the Union has no right to change the Constitution of the Union which it is not a member of, as to the rights and interests of the people of the States within the Union.

Virginia was recognized by Mr. Lincoln as a State of the Union while the war was on, and she was recognized as such during the war, and afterwards by the chief of the various departments of the government. She has been recognized as such not only by the President of the United States, but by the United States Supreme Court, and has repeatedly been a party to suits in that court against the State of West Virginia. Yet she has been treated all this time as our, and called upon to agree to all the requirements of the reconstruction acts, before she could come in. And when she had agreed to every one, she is brought in, like an Eagle in a Cage.

COMPOUNDING FELONIES.—From the N. Y. Journal of Commerce.—Judge Ingraham, in his charge to the grand jury on the compounding of felonies, asserts what we are sorry to say, is a well known, but not a very common, but a very serious crime. For some years now it has been the custom of banks, brokers, and other individuals, to treat directly or indirectly with the thieves for a return of the plunder, promising them freedom from arrest and prosecution. This is plainly the compounding of a felony, and a criminal offence. On moral grounds it cannot be defended. All that can be said in its behalf is, that long continued and undisturbed custom has lent a certain sanction of respectability to it, and that there are hundreds of citizens of blameless lives, who would shrink from the commission of a crime, known and stamped as such, but who do make private settlements with burglars and thieves for the broad shelter of their own names and interests. For many years there has been no prosecution for the compounding of the class of felonies referred to, though grand juries and policemen could at any moment have placed their hands on scores of men of high business standing who have been guilty of it. Scarcely a day passes but policemen themselves rely to a great extent on compromising as a means of recovering stolen goods, and when consulted by citizens who have been robbed, advise them to settle privately with the thieves. This policy is believed to be the main stay of the detective system of New York and of other great cities, and its prevalence is by no means unknown and unpracticed in the offices of prosecuting attorneys and criminal justices.

FREEDMEN'S SAVINGS BANK.—A few days since William J. Wilson (colored), the Cashier of the Freedmen's Savings Bank at Washington, visited this city to endeavor to increase the interest of that class of our population in the institution. He and others have made speeches at several points in the city. As one of the results already perceptible on Thursday, twenty five new depositors put into the bank over \$1,000, and on yesterday twenty six new depositors put in \$1,000. Last night he and others held a meeting at Chintzworth, and will hold another in Manchester. Much of the money which has thus been brought to light is sold and silver, which has an old and musty smell about it, as if many years had passed since it had ceased to be a circulating medium. The bank takes this money at current value, even the depositors certificates at currency valuation. Last month they received on deposit about \$3,000. This amount has already been exceeded this month, and will be largely increased before its close. The amount on deposit here is about \$150,000 on which an interest of five per cent, per annum, compounded three times during the year, is paid. At the end of every fourth month the interest is computed and added to the original sum.—Rich. Dispatch.
