**ALEXANDER H. STEPHENS.**—A letter from  
Crawfordsville, Ga., the home of Hon Alexan-  
der H. Stephens, says:

"I spent the day recently with Mr. Stephens,  
at his residence here, (Liberty Hall). This is  
an unassuming country house—a white frame  
building, erected with an eye to comfort and  
convenience, which end its proprietor has most  
successfully attained. It is the coolest, coolest,  
most inviting bachelor's retreat I ever visited—  
opening upon a grassy lawn, unusual in this  
State, and shaded by a number of pretty oaks,  
locusts, &c. I found Mr. Stephens looking  
very pale and emaciated, reclining in his in-  
valid chair, and intently discussing some la-  
tely extremely feeble, when interested or  
excited he would sit up erect, his remarkable  
eye would sparkle with its old fire, and he  
would address his hearers in an animated and  
always convincing strain. It is his custom,  
when the weather is fine, to sit in his easy-  
chair in the veranda, and as he converses,  
wheels himself slowly back and forth by a con-  
venient arrangement which costs him but little  
effort, and, as he says, exercises and streng-  
thens his arms and chest. When the sun gets  
low he calls for his crutches and hobbles slow-  
ly over the lawn and through his well kept gar-  
den, in which he seems much interested. Hav-  
ing but a partial use of his legs, Mr. Stephens  
walks with difficulty on his crutches. He says  
his hip is dislocated, and thinks he will never  
be able to lay his crutches aside.

**ASSORTING COLORS.**—Ladies who make un-  
dressing use of color, not by painting their faces,  
but by a deep and subtle study of toilet, will  
find in the most varied shades of old time a chance  
to test their taste, for they cannot be worn in-  
discriminately. If ladies would study the re-  
lation that colors bear to each other they would  
not only avoid gross errors in dress, but in  
house furnishing, and all other matters in  
which color is concerned. One of the simplest  
methods of learning to make a practical appli-  
cation of these principles is to take different  
colored skeins of Berlin wool, or a collection of  
flowers, and place them side by side, and see  
what effect they have upon one another, there-  
by determining the complementary or contrast  
color, keeping apart those that cannot come  
together without quarreling. In this way it  
will soon be discovered that the pink of the  
completion is best brought out by a green set-  
ting in a bonnet, and that any lady of a fair  
complexion can make effective use of a delicate  
green crape, while black haired beauties with  
olive complexions increase the freshness of  
their by yellow. Blue is the standard color  
for blondes, but as there happen to be two or  
three shades this season it will require nice dis-  
crimination to select the exact one. The rose-  
red crapes should be worn by brunettes of pale  
complexions, not by those who already have  
rosy ones, because this color has the effect to  
heighten the rose tint.

**MANITOWAH LAKE,** which has given a title  
to the province formed out of the Red river  
region, derives its name from a small island  
from which, in the stillness of night, issues a  
"mysterious voice," though there is no real  
"mystery" about it. On no account will the  
Ojibwa approach or land upon this island,  
supposing it to be the home of the Manitowah,  
—"the Speaking God." The cause of this  
curious sound is the beating of the waves on  
the "shingle," or large pebbles lining the  
shores. Along the northern coast of the island  
there is a long low cliff of fine grained compact  
limestone, which, under the stroke of the ham-  
mer, clicks like steel. The waves beating on  
the shore at the foot of the cliff cause the fallen  
fragments to rub against each other, and to  
give out a sound resembling the chiming of dis-  
tant church bells.—This phenomenon occurs  
when the gales blow from the north, and then,  
as the winds subside, low, wailing sounds, like  
whispering voices, are heard in the air.

**A NEW THORNLESS BLACKBERRY.**—Culti-  
vators have not been quite satisfied with the  
blackberries called thornless, which have hith-  
erto been propagated. It is a matter of ap-  
proach to have plants which can be ap-  
proached without danger of tearing the skin or  
clothes of those who gather the fruit; but this  
quality in the blackberry has hitherto been ac-  
companied with inferiority in the fruit itself.  
A new variety has been obtained by Rufus R.  
Fletcher of Groton Junction, in Massachusetts,  
called the New Thornless Wachuset Blackberry,  
which according to the testimony of Mr.  
Daniel Needham, Secretary of the New Eng-  
land Agricultural Society, and others, is of very  
high promise. It is described as perfectly har-  
dly, very productive, and of a fine, high flavor,  
and as to the thorns, though not without them,  
they are so short as to occasion no inconve-  
nience. Mr. Needham calls it the best black-  
berry he has ever tasted.

**A FLORAL CURIOSITY.**—A gentleman from  
the country, whose name we did not learn,  
brought to Williams & Moore, to day, a floral  
freak which we have no doubt will astonish  
the most profound botanist. It is a white rose  
which grew on an apple tree. The tree and  
rose bush grew close together, and it is sup-  
posed that the latter so impregnated the tender  
bud as it was about to bloom as to transform  
it into a rose. So complete is the transforma-  
tion, that the stem, and even the flavor, is  
similar to that of a rose, some of the inner  
petals only having the tint of the apple blossom.  
The effect is somewhat novel, to see a  
tall blown white rose actually growing in the  
midst of a cluster of large apple leaves.
