THE FIFTH AVENUE HOTEL FIRE.—The Coroner's inquest on the bodies of the victims of the fire at the Fifth-avenue Hotel was commenced yesterday. In the name of humanity, let it be searching and thorough. As far as the conduct of those in charge of the hotel on that fearful night is concerned, the latest and more complete accounts only make what was bad enough already infinitely worse, and more than justify all that was said before. If an alarm had been given at once, every one of those unfortunate girls might have been rescued, and New York been spared the ghastly horror of that long row of dead bodies at the morgue. But "the proprietors, in their anxiety to save the furniture and carpets, wanted to put the fire out themselves." So they went to work with buckets and hose, and wet blankets. Their money was at stake. The guests, when disturbed by the noise, were quietly soothed with evasive answers, which were soon falsehoods. Every attendant was put to work as quietly as possible. No attempt was made to give warning to a single individual, whether in danger in the garret of that vast structure, or comparatively safe on the ground floor. All the inmates were left to find out their danger and take care of themselves. All this while there rang in the ears of those engaged in this work of fighting the ever-increasing flames, the piercing shrieks of the girls who were being burned to death in the garret without an effort being made to save them; the aid of the firemen, who could have rescued them, being deliberately ignored, in order to "save the furniture and carpets." The heart sickens at the fate that came upon these domestic, and the scenes at the morgue are simply horrible.—Balt. Gazette.
