### Home Attachment of Domesticated Animals.

Some time ago an account was given of a dog that had been carried seven hundred miles somewhere at the West, but not liking the place, alone, guided by a faculty quite unknown to man, he footed his way to his own loved home without making inquiries, consulting a guide-board, or travelling out of the way, at the rate of nearly a hundred miles each day.

An old horse, purchased by a farmer in Vermont years since, was shipped at Seabrook, Connecticut, with others, to the West Indies, for grinding cane. A storm occurring in Long Island Sound, the deck horses were washed overboard and supposed to have been lost. The old Vermont, however, reached land in the darkness of a stormy night, and finally was found standing at the barn door of his old home. The horse had never been far from the town till sold into slavery, therefore could not have been familiar with the way.

Carrier pigeons perform feats as swift messengers through the air, because they are in a hurry to reach home. However far they may be carried, confined in baskets, they invariably speed their way without ever resting on the voyage till they reach the place dear to their affection. Lithgow, the Scotch traveller, says a carrier pigeon has carried a letter from Babylon to Aleppo in forty-eight hours, while it would take a man thirty days. They were formerly so highly estimated for government messengers, in 1574 that the Prince of Orange ordered them to be maintained at the public expense. In 1819, with a view to ascertaining their speed, a pigeon was carried from Antwerp to London and there liberated. The bird was at its cote, having flown 180 miles in a straight line, in just six hours.

Another pigeon let loose at Bury-St. Edwards was seen at the clock struck nine a. m., arrived at its home, Bull Inn, Bishopgate street, London, at half past eleven the same morning, having flown 72 miles in two hours and a half.

Horses, mules, dogs, cats and all the migrating birds find their way as unerringly as the carrier pigeon does, but how they do it is beyond our ken. Some imagine birds see telegraphically one or two hundred miles when high in the air, over the tops of mountains. But that theory throws no light upon the movements of the stupid mule that found his home in Brazil, hundreds of miles over a region where man could hardly move, having neither a path to follow nor a companion to lead the way. Science, therefore, has something more to do to clear up this mystery.

A THRILLING SCENE.—The Harrisburg State Journal, of Monday, says: The recent snow storm rendered it necessary to remove some of the surplus snow from the roofs of many buildings throughout the city, to prevent the immense pressure upon them. On Saturday afternoon last, a number of hands were engaged shoveling off superfluous heaps of "drifted flakes" from the flat portion of the roof of the Capitol building. Harry Smith, a lad aged about fifteen years, whose parents reside on North street, near Second, applied for a "job," which was given him, and while proceeding to work, he was told to be careful how he went about it. He was at work on the north wing of the building, over the Senate chamber, and had commenced at the bottom of a gutter, where he had a secure foothold, instead of beginning at the top, to shovel away the snow.

While busy at work, and not noticing the gradual giving away or sliding down of the snow, the entire mass above him came down like an avalanche, and shoved him down over the slate roof, some twenty-five feet further, to the gutter on the verge of the wall, where, fortunately, he was held by his clothing, his legs hanging out over the roof. The distance from this point to the icy pavement below was at least sixty-five feet, and the men immediately above him, as well as persons who moved up and down Fourth and State streets, and witnessed the perilous situation of the lad, shut their eyes or turned their heads, momentarily expecting the boy to drop upon the pavement, a mangled mass of flesh and bones. The men upon the roof, Messrs. Felzer, Miller, and others, with commendable presence of mind, shouted to Harry to remain perfectly quiet; that they would rescue him in a very short time. A rope was procured from a box somewhere in the upper portion of the dome, and speedily let down to where the boy sat, and was suspended. But he had become so cold and chilled; and was somewhat deterred from fright, that he would not trust his weight to be pulled up, by simply holding on with his hands. He was then peremptorily ordered to fasten the rope around his body, and to do this speedily; but before the young man could accomplish this half an hour had elapsed, and he made five attempts to fasten the rope about his waist before he was hauled up to the top of the building, chilled through and through and almost insensible.

He was carried into the furnace rooms in the basement of the Capitol, and by means of stimulants, rubbing, and a "regular" toasting, was placed upon his feet "all right." The lad said that at one time he thought it was "all up" with him, and expected to fall upon the pavement and be dashed into pieces.

SINGULAR PHENOMENON.—Three miles from Bainbridge, Ross county, is located a hill of considerable altitude, known as "Coppers Mountain." Out of the top of this mountain issues a constant stream of smoke, while on its summit and general surface the vegetation has withered and died; until the whole hill presents a barren, sterile and desolate aspect, blasted as if by a whirlwind of fire. It is believed that the interior of the hill is a mass of ignited combustible matter, and that the fire is and has been spreading with considerable rapidity. The theory presented to account for it is that on or about the 1st day of last October the party to whom the land belongs was burning brush on the hill-side, and that the flames communicated to inflammable matter, probably crude oil, coal, or combustible substances, contained in the geological formation of the hill. The quenching of the fire is, of course, impossible from its situation, and how soon, if ever, the fire will reach a point where it can be controlled, can only be conjectured. At present there is no danger to be apprehended to property in the vicinity.
