A BEAR STORY.—The adventure of Gen. Israel Putnam with the wolf or bear, or whatever it was in the cave, will be remembered by most of our readers better than we recollect it. California considers that two of her sons have given an evidence of future greatness that throws the rest of the world into the shade. Now for these California heroes—John Day and John L. Day. They tracked a large bear to a cave on Hay Press Flat. The opening was only about two feet high and not two feet wide. Providing themselves with a torch, they entered. Through labyrinthine passages they cautiously moved. At last they saw the bear, a genuine grizzly of four hundred pounds, in a deep crevice of the rocks. John L. Day held his rifle cocked John Day flashed his torch, and the bear took the offensive. Rushing toward the bear, with the instinct of his kind, he reared on his hind legs within two feet of the hunters. At that moment J. L. Day called to the sights of his gun. This was done and the light flaring full on Bruin's orbs compelled him to turn his head to one side. This was the critical moment, and the senior Day improved it to discharge, with unerring aim, the contents of his rifle just at the butt of Bruin's ear, and disoriented his neck. The bear pitched forward in the agonies of death. The hunters were within his reach and unable to escape. So close were they that in his dying throes they were caught by his claws and could not help themselves. Happily they were not injured. That is the way they sometimes kill bears in California.—Baltimore Gazette
