A little son of Mr. James Cole fell in the gutter at the intersection of Pitt and Princess streets, yesterday afternoon, during the rain, and the water having raised about eight inches over the top of the bridge there, was being carried into the trunk, in which he was necessarily have been drowned, when he was seized by a colored man and rescued. The water was barked up at the intersection of Royal and Princess streets until a large lake was formed there.
