GERMAN SAUCES.—To the average American the dishes that find the most favor with our German friends seem only fit to be carefully compounded and then thrown out of the window. But some good English gourmet has taken the trouble to prepare a cook-book based on the cuisine of the Faderland, which certainly contains a good many recipes that read with a relish. The Germans are not nearly so skillful in the kitchen as the French, but they can give good advice to the English and to us Americans, for all that. They waste almost as much in senseless boiling as we do, and they like combinations—such as roast pork with caraway seed, coffee mixed with carrots and caraway seed, soup made with beer and eggs and potato flour—that appall the Anglo-Saxon stomach. But their salads are multifarious and excellent, and some of their sauces are worthy of Soyer. Here is one for wild ducks, which we commend to Mr. Taft: "Boil the peel of two Seville oranges; squeeze in their juice; add a glass of white wine and some gravy, and just before serving a little cayenne pepper." It is simple but it seems admirably adapted to a high flavored bird, and just that sort of an accompaniment to a duck which we should suppose. From some hints dropped in his "Memorials of Germanizing," would have delighted Thackeray.—Here is a salad dressing that has fine flavor about it, if one does not stick at the bacon fat: "Cut three or four ounces of streaked bacon into very small pieces, and fry them in a steppan a pale color, but crisp. Beat the yolks of three eggs with a spoonful of flour, a small wineglass of vinegar, and half as much water again; add a spoonful of made mustard, some salt and pepper. Put this to the bacon in the steppan, and stir it over the fire until thick and smooth. The bacon fat supplies the place of oil. It must be stirred while cooling, and used when quite cool. Should it be thicker than cream, thin it with a little vinegar and water, well stirred in." There is also an appealing asparagus salad, with lemon juice instead of vinegar for dressing; and a like dish made of tender young hop leaves is hardly one of the objectionable features of German cooking.

STRANGE SCENE IN A CHURCH.—A Chicago letter in the New York World says: "An extraordinary scene occurred in Calvary Episcopal Church on Sunday last, which has so far escaped notice in the local press. Rev. J. F. Walker, the rector, was noticed by his congregation to be in apparently ill health and to read service in the morning with an unusual feebleness. When, however, he came to the sermon he broke down completely, and in a few startling sentences announced the reason. He had not dined the day before, he said, as he had no money wherewith to go marketing, and all that he had eaten on Saturday and Sunday was bread and butter and tea. When he went home on Sunday he was not sure that he should even find that. The congregation rose and departed without any further sermon. Calvary parish is not a very large or wealthy one, but, it is abundantly able to support its incumbent. Mr. Walker is a gentleman of ability, education, and zeal, and his case will cause a sensation when it is now made public.

I may add that Mr. Walker had invitations to more dinners on Sunday last than he could have eaten in a month; but his parishoners feel sore upon the subject, and think that the exposure was not seemly. Their neglect is probably owing to the fact that the rector has a small private income of his own, which, however, is fully taken up in the education of his children.

A EX-MAYOR CHARGED WITH FORGERY.—The Rochester Union and Advertiser of the 22d inst. publishes an account of a case of forgery in that city, the party accused being Charles H. Clark, formerly mayor. It was first discovered that the banking house of Erickson, Jennings & Monford a few days since received a note for \$500 purporting to be made by Platt C. Vele, and endorsed by Charles H. Clark, Addison Gardner and a third person, a customer of the bank, whose name was not learned. When the note became due it was protested, and Judge Gardner served with a notice of protest. He at once pronounced his signature a forgery. Mr. Platt C. Vele was consulted, and he stated that his name was forged to the note. It was ascertained that several parties in the city held paper purporting to be made by Nehemiah Osburn, and endorsed by Clark, and that Mr. Osburn had declared his signature a forgery. In a drawer in Mr. Clark's office this forenoon two notes, filled up for different amounts and made payable to Charles H. Clark, and bearing the signature of N. Osburn, but not endorsed, were found. The signatures of Mr. Osburn were forgeries. How much of this forged paper is afloat cannot now be stated, but it will amount to several thousand dollars. Mr. Clark is dangerously ill, and it is thought by his physicians will not recover.

NIGHT AIR.—When doctors disagree who shall decide? Here is ap M. D. in the Herald of Health who advises us by no means to raise our window at night and thereby sleep in a ventilated and cool room. An apartment were told, badly ventilated but warm, never killed any one; rooms too cool, and breezy, often have. In one, the sleeper is moderately poisoned, if at all; in the other, the lungs get congested and many of the ills that flesh is heir to fly in at the open window. We turn to the Sanitarian of the same month, also published in New York, and we find that "the old fashioned dream of night air is so rapidly disappearing that it will soon be referred to as one of the singular prejudices of by-gone age!" Now, says the author, I have not the slightest doubt that if any individuals in the city of New York were to slip on the housetops instead of in their sleeping rooms the rate of mortality would be reduced twenty-five per cent. in three months. There is a radical difference here; but we believe Miss Florence Nightingale knows, as an experienced nurse, more about the matter than most physicians, and she tells us that the first thing to be done in a sick room is to raise the window night and day—that air at night is no more injurious than in the day time.
